5. hitch	5.	a slight problem or difficulty which causes a short delay.

30. rotate	30.	to turn in a circular movement.
31. touchy	31.	used to describe someone who is easily upset, offended, or irritated.

33. gingerly	33.	in a careful manner, as if you expect what you are doing to be dangerous, unpleasant, or painful.
34. religion	34.	the belief in a god or gods and the activities that are connected with this belief, such as praying or worshipping.
